Enclosed you will find a set of Notices or Statements related to the benefits provided to you through National Employees Health Plan. Although you may have received similar notices in the past, each is important and you should read them all carefully and retain each for future reference.

- **Privacy Notice and Statement** – Together these help you understand the systems and procedures that National Employees Health Plan utilizes in order to secure our data and information.
- **Women’s Health and Cancer Rights Act of 1998** – This Act and notice explain the coverage’s mandated for cosmetic surgery subsequent to breast cancer.
- **Newborns’ and Mothers’ Health Protection Act** – This Act and notice explain the coverage’s mandated for maternity stays.
- **Summary Annual Report** – This notice provides certain insurance information, a basic financial statement for the Plan and advises you of your rights for additional information regarding the Plans’ financial status.
- **Notice of Open Enrollment** – This includes your enrollment forms.
- **Notice of Special Enrollment Rights** – This notice advises you of your special enrollment rights under Federal Law.
- **Notice of Opportunity to Enroll Adult Dependent Children to Age 26** – This notice expands coverage for children up to the age of 26 years.
- **The Children’s Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (CHIPRA)** – This new special enrollment events occur when an employee or dependent child lose coverage for Medicaid or State Children’s Health Insurance.
- **Notice of Creditable Coverage** – Explains your rights and responsibilities under Medicare’s new prescription drug benefit based on your existing prescription drug coverage.
