

Summary Annual Report for the National Employees Health Plan

This is a summary of the annual report of the NATIONAL EMPLOYEES HEALTH PLAN, (Employer Identification Number 38-6440898, Welfare Plan 501) for the plan year beginning November 1, 2008 and ending October 31, 2009.

The annual report has been filed with the Pension and Welfare Benefits Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The National Employees Health Plan has committed itself to pay certain medical, dental, vision, prescription drug and short term disability claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

Insurance Information

The plan has experience rated contracts with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and non-experience rated contracts with Blue Care Network, Health Alliance Plan, Vista Health Plan and Fort Dearborn Life to pay certain medical and life claims incurred under the terms of the plan. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending October 31, 2009 were \$12,893,162.

Because, they are so called "experience-rated" contracts, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the plan year ending October 31, 2009, the premiums paid under such "experience-rated" contracts were \$7,111,662 and the total of all benefit claims paid under these experience rated contracts during the plan year was \$7,011,155.

Basic Financial Statement

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$7,379,038 as of October 31, 2009, compared to \$6,575,770 as of November 1, 2008. During the plan year the plan experienced an increase in net assets of \$803,268. This increase included unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. During the plan year, the plan had total income of \$14,773,903 including employer contributions of \$13,707,411, employee contributions of \$182,794, a realized gain of \$39,879 from the sale of assets, and earnings from investments of \$843,819 which includes \$655,407 in unrealized depreciation. Plan expenses were \$13,970,635. These expenses included \$654,123 in administrative expenses, \$13,297,808 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries, and \$18,704 in investment expenses.

If you request a copy of the full annual report from the plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the plan, ABS, Inc., 8220 Irving, Sterling Heights, MI 48312 and at the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, D.C., or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs.
